SCHEDULING ORDER

It is hereby **ORDERED** that the following pretrial deadlines shall govern this case:

- The parties shall have until **May 28, 2018**, to **COMPLETE DISCOVERY**.
- Thereafter, the parties shall have until **June 22, 2018**, to file appropriate summary judgment motions demonstrating why a permanent injunction should or should not issue, and seeking all other appropriate relief.¹
- A hearing will be held to resolve any motions on **July 20, 2018**.
- The parties may request in writing that additional pretrial deadlines be set should they wish to do so.


It is further **ORDERED** that this case shall be **ADMINISTRATIVELY**

¹ All summary judgment issues shall be presented in the same pleading unless leave of court is first obtained. As required by Local Civil Rule 56, each brief in support of a motion for summary judgment must include a separately captioned section with the brief listing, in number-paragraph form, each material fact that the movant contends is undisputed with appropriate citations to the record. A brief in opposition to a motion for summary judgment must include a separately captioned section within the brief addressing, in numbered-paragraph form corresponding to the movant’s section, each of the movant’s enumerated facts and indicating whether the non-movant admits or disputes the fact with appropriate citations to the record. The Court may assume that any fact identified by the movant as undisputed in the movant’s brief that his not specifically controverted in the non-movant’s brief in the manner set forth above is admitted for the purpose of deciding the motion for summary judgment.

CLOSED during the discovery period, and shall be reopened on June 22, 2018, after summary judgment motions are filed.

The Clerk is directed to provide a copy of this Order to all counsel of record.
